Probe Putt-Putt

Families were invited into the school to attend our first ever Probe Putt-Putt event. Students worked together to create a fun and engaging mini-golf course using recycled materials and other artifacts. We were also able to have a record number of families complete the Alberta Education Assurance Survey (specific to parents/guardians of grade 4 students). This data will be used to guide the development of our school education plan, which we will be sharing this Fall.



Exploratory Time @ Dr. Probe

On Fridays, we have started Exploratory Time. Each teacher facilitates an activity that students choose from, such as drumming, yoga, pound fitness, hand chimes, crib, Tinkerkad/3D printing, art and stitching. This is a great way for teachers to build connections with students outside of their class and for students to learn new skills. Ask your child what Exploratory activity they chose!



Speech Language Assistant Spotlight Mrs. Dorita

One day, our Speech Language Pathologist (SLP), Mrs. Amanda lent Mrs. Dorita her new book called, This Is Not My Hat by Jon Klassen. Mrs. Dorita planned on using and reading this book with her students that day to target their speech and language goals in small groups. So, as you can imagine, this could look very different or similar depending on who we were working with and what we were targeting. For our students working on speech sounds, Mrs. Dorita would intentionally make MISTAKES with her own speech sounds... [cue the DUN DUN] and then would WAIT to see if the students would notice her speech sound error(s)... and all the students noticed ... however they all responded a little bit differently. One student would furrow their eyebrows at Mrs. Dorita, while another student would say "Mrs. Dorita, please thtop (i.e. stop)", and other students were more timid about correcting Mrs. Dorita, but she would encourage everyone to discuss how she made an error by accident and then the students had no problem talking about Mrs. Dorita's speech sound errorsss. In all speech groups, the students would practice saying the sound that Mrs. Dorita made an error on at the word and sentence level! For our students working on language goals, Mrs. Dorita would SPARKLE descriptive words to learn and talk about, such as "CAMOUFLAGE" and "IMAGINATION", by talking about what the words meant and how the word was used in the story. If you have ever read this story, then you would know that This Is Not My Hat is an open-ended story, which means that we do NOT actually know how the story ended. Mrs. Dorita and the students would brainstorm about how the story ended. The students also had the opportunity to discuss the feelings and emotions of the characters in the book, to talk about right and wrong actions, and to answer (and learn how to answer/get better at answering) a variety of WH questions (e.g., who, what, where, when, how, and why).

So, the moral of the story is that Mrs. Dorita is amazing at what she does and can take any activity and incorporate it into our students' speech and language goals.



Learning Commons

As we entered March, the focus in the Learning Commons had been on the competency of "Communication". Students have been participating in Maker Stations that focus on this competency and well as tapping in their their creativity and ingenuity.




